1. What is the report about?

- 1.1 An application was received from Ross Newham seeking the variation of a premises licence for the above premises, which currently has in place a premises licence for the sale by retail of alcohol to be consumed off the premises. The licence was originally granted in September 2014. Mr Newham would like to vary his existing licence to increase the sale of alcohol from 23.00 to 02.00 and to add a condition following advice from the Devon & Cornwall Police.
 - For the sale of alcohol by retail to be consumed off the premises.
 - Monday to Sunday from 06.00 to 02.00.
 - 'A dedicated SIA registered door supervisor will be employed at the premises when they are open beyond 23.00'.
- 1.2 The application received is attached at Appendix A.

2. Are there any representations?

- 2.1. Three relevant representations based on the prevention of crime and disorder, public nuisance and public safety have been received in response to this application. The representations are attached at Appendix B.
- 2.2. No representations have been received from any Responsible Authority.

2.3. **3. Report details:**

3.1 Since the premises licence was granted in September 2014 there have been two recorded incidents of crime and disorder at the premises. No complaints have been recorded on any issues of public nuisance or public safety.

4. What are the legal aspects?

- 4.1 The Licensing Sub-Committee are required to have regard to the Statement of Licensing Policy which states in part (paragraph 2.8) that in determining a licence application the Licensing Authority will consider each application on its merits. Licence conditions will be tailored to the individual application and only those appropriate to meet the licensing objectives will be imposed.
- 4.2 The Premises is situated within the area designated as the Cumulative Impact Zone.
- 4.3 The Licensing Sub-Committee are required to have regard to the Official Guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 revised March 2015 is relevant.

The official guidance relating to crime and disorder to which this committee must have regard, is included in the Yellow Committee hand books.

- 4.4 The Licensing Sub-Committee must have regard to the relevant representation made; the evidence provided in relation to the premises from the parties involved and the evidence it hears, in reaching its decision.
- 4.4 The Licensing Sub-Committee, having regard to the representation, must take such of the following steps, if any, as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives and either modify conditions by altering, omitting or adding them or rejecting the whole or part of the application, and for this purpose the conditions of the licence are modified if any of them is altered or omitted or any new condition is added.

5. Recommendations:

5.1 The Licensing Sub-Committee are required to identify what steps, if any, need to be taken to determine the application.

Re: Application from Costcutter 12/13 - Variation of License

I am writing to raise concerns regarding the above application, under Public safety and Prevention of public nuisance of the 4 licensing objectives.

This store currently closes at 11pm and now wishes to open until 2am with the provision of sale of alcohol.

Residents who live opposite these premises have questioned "who is walking the streets at this time of the morning unless they have been "clubbing" and already consumed alcohol?

Public safety must be questioned. The premises next door is a taxi office and many people queue here for their services, many already having had too much to drink and the opportunity whilst waiting for a taxi to buy and consume even more alcohol, could easily lead to disorder and raise issues over public safety.

Prevention of Public Nuisance. There is already a level of disturbance to residents who actually live in South Street, due to late night/early morning eating and taxi facilities, the opportunity to buy more alcohol (and consume) whilst on the street raises more concerns on the issue of public nuisance.

Drinking on the street would be in direct conflict with the DPPO or the new PSPO when it comes into force, and would need to be monitored.

Granting premises further/extended alcohol licenses when it will be in direct conflict with these protection orders seems irresponsible.

There seems no justification or necessary need for this store to be open until 2am for the sale of alcohol.

The Prevention Of Crime And Disorder

We wish to register our Objections with regard to the above application:

Giving the people who are leaving the Pubs and Clubs and are waiting for taxis easy access to more alcohol will increase the noise and disturbance and increase drinking on the street.

We already experience revellers urinating on our steps in George Street and vomit + urine in the alley leading from South Street to George Street. Being able to obtain more alcohol will increase this problem.

There will be an increase in customers in cars coming to South Street to purchase alcohol causing yet more noise and disturbance.

We understand people need to enjoy themselves but we as residents of South Street also need to sleep before 2am.

I hear by object to the application for the above license due to being a frequent visitor to this area and viewing the effect of alcohol relate incidents in south street every weekend.

People falling over in the street and the road way, people being sick by the fast food takeaways and people urinating in the area opposite KFC fast food chain, I have talked to a couple of the branded supermarkets managers in the area, none of the supermarkets in the area sell Alcohol pass 12 midnight and when you talk to the managers of the supermarkets, they have been also asked to restrict the sale of Alcohol from 2300 hrs by the local police force to help them reduce the number of incidents of unsociable behaviour.
