1. What is the report about?

- 1.1 An application attached as Appendix A has been received from Jenna Heasman the owner of Meat59 (Exeter) Limited, for the VARIATION of a premises licence. The existing premises licence is attached as Appendix B.
- 1.2 The existing licence provisions are as follows:
 - Late night refreshment (indoors) Monday to Saturday 23.00 00.00 Sunday and Good Friday 23.00 – 23.30 New Year's Eve 23.00 – 05.00 Christmas Day 23.00 - 23.30
 - Supply of alcohol (on sales) Monday to Saturday 10.00 00.00 Sunday and Good Friday Noon – 23.30 New Year's Eve 10.00 – 10.00 (New Year's Day) Christmas Day Noon – 23.30
 - Opening Hours Monday to Sunday 24 hours.

The proposed variation:

- Late night refreshment (indoors and outdoors) Monday to Sunday 23.00 – 00.00 Remove non –standard timings for Good Friday and Christmas Day.
- Supply of alcohol (on and off sales) Monday to Sunday 08.00 – 00.00 Remove non-standard timings for Good Friday and Christmas Day.

The applicant would like to remove the following conditions.

'CCTV shall be installed, operated and maintained to the satisfaction of the Chief of Police'.

'Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied on the premises otherwise than to persons taking table meals and for consumption by such person as an ancillary to their meal'.

The applicant would like add the following conditions:

'The premises shall adopt a 'Challenge 21 age verification policy'.

'The provision of emergency lighting'.

'There will be clear, legible signage requesting customers leave the premises quietly'.

1.3 The premises has been open on Magdalen Road since 28 April 2017 and is currently operating under the existing premises licence. The premises is primarily food led and specialises in gourmet burgers using fresh locally sourced products. The company, Meat59 already has an established restaurant operating in Torquay.

2. Are there any representations?

- 2.1 Five representations have been received from interested parties situated in the vicinity of the premises. The representations address the concerns of the local people and business' to potential crime and disorder and public nuisance regarding the proposed variation. These are attached as Appendix C (please note the representations have had personal information redacted).
- 2.2 No representations have been received by a Responsible Authority.

3. Report details:

3.1 The application was advertised on the premises and in the local newspaper in accordance with the requirements of the Licensing Act 2003.

4. Legal and Policy Considerations:

- 4.3 The Licensing Sub-Committee are required to have regard to;
 - 4.3.1 the representations (including supporting information) presented by all the parties;
 - 4.3.2 the Official Guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 revised April 2017;
 - 4.3.3 the Licensing Authorities Statement of Licensing Policy.

- 4.5 The Licensing Sub-Committee, having regard to the representations, must take such of the following steps, if any, as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the Licensing Objectives.

- to modify the conditions of the licence; and/or
- to reject the whole or part of the application.

If the Licensing Sub-Committee considers that none of the above steps are appropriate for the promotion of the Licensing Objectives the Application shall be taken as granted as applied for.





ANNEXE 1 - MANDATORY CONDITIONS

There shall be no sale or supply of alcohol when there is no Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) in respect of this premises licence or at a time when the said Premises Supervisor does not hold a personal licence or when his/her licence is suspended.

Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Any person used to carry out a security activity must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

An irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children-

(a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to-

(i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or

(ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);

(b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the

public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);

(c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;

(d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on-

(i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or

(ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;

(e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.

The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).

The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

The responsible person shall ensure that-

(a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures-

(i) beer or cider: 1/2 pint;

(ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and

(iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and

(b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.
