



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INDEX OF MULTIPLE DEPRIVATION

The English Indices of Deprivation measures relative levels of deprivation in small areas of England called Lower Super Output Areas (LSOAs). The overall measure is called the Index of Multiple Deprivation (IMD). This produces an IMD score (bar chart below showing score in 2015) and a national rank out of 32844 LSOAs (trend in national rank shown in line chart below). Deprivation and health are closely connected, with areas with higher levels of deprivation tending to experience poorer health outcomes. Reducing social inequalities in health is a major focus of the work of Health and Wellbeing Boards.

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
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INDICES OF DEPRIVATION DOMAINS

The Indices of Deprivation are comprised of an overall Index of Multiple Deprivation (IMD); seven domains which contribute to the overall index covering income, employment, health, education, barriers to housing and services, crime and living environment; and two supplementary indices relating to income deprivation in children (under 16) & older people (60+).

The following chart compares the area's national rank on the IMD, seven domains and two supplementary indices in 2015, with the average ranks Devon as a whole. The value axis ranges from the most deprived LSOA in the country (1) to the least deprived LSOA in the country (32844) on a given measure, and the chart is further divided into five sections highlighting the national deprivation group (quintile).




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INDICES OF DEPRIVATION SUB-DOMAINS

Certain domains of the Indices of Deprivation include further sub-domains. The education, skills and training domain includes a children and young people subdomain, and a adult skills sub-domains. The barriers to housing and services domain includes a geographic barriers sub-domain, and a wider barriers subdomain. The living environment domain includes an indoor environment (housing conditions) sub-domain, and an outdoor environment sub-domain.

The following chart compares the area's national rank on these six sub-domains in 2015, with the average ranks for Devon as a whole. The value axis ranges from the most deprived LSOA in the country (1) to the least deprived LSOA in the country (32844) on a given measure, and the chart is further divided into five sections highlighting the national deprivation group (quintile).






JOBSEEKERS ALLOWANCE CLAIMANT RATE






Alcohol: Increasing and higher risk drinking in persons aged 16 and over

Number and share of population using different health care providers








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PERMANENT ADMISSIONS TO CARE HOMES

Permanent admissions to care homes in area per 100,000 population aged 65 and over.







Household (HH) characteristics highlights features of the household and dwelling, including how many are headed by a lone parent, lack a car or van, along with aspects of occupancy and housing including overcrowding and central heating. Average household size is the number of people in the are divided by the number of households. Housing tenure shows the percentage of household spaces in different forms of ownership. Ethnicity shows the percentage of the total population in different ethnic groups. In the health section, general health is reported on a five point scale from very good to very bad, and this measure shows the percentage of people who rate their health as bad of very bad. The question on long-term illness and disability in the 2011 census asked if peoples day-to-day activities were limited because of a health problem or disability which has lasted, or is expected to last at least 12 months, including problems relating to old age. These measures show the percentage limited and the percentage limited a lot both for the total population, and for those aged 16 to 64 only. Finally, caring responsibilities and the time spent on them are recorded, relating to both family members and acquaintances looked after because of long-term physical or mental ill-health/disability, or old age. 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GLOSSARY OF TERMS

Crude Rate

A crude rate is the number of cases in an area per head of population.

Direct Age Standardised Rate (DASR)

An age-adjusted rate which shows the rate that would have occurred if the observed age-specific rates had occurred in a standard population.

Confidence Interval

A confidence interval is a statistical range which indicates the level of uncertainty around a particular figure, as seen in the whisker lines on charts.

Statistical Significance

The likelihood that a result or relationship is caused by something other than random chance.

Life Expectancy

The average period that a person may expect to live. This is represented as a figure 'at birth', and as figures for life expectancy from a defined age.

GEOGRAPHIC AREAS

This section describes the geographic areas available within the JSNA profiles

Lower Super Output Areas (LSOAs) are areas defined by the Office for National Statistics for the release of small area data. There are 457 in Devon.

Middle Super Output Areas (MSOAs) are groupings of LSOAs agreed by the local authority and the Office for National Statistics. There are 107 in Devon.

Wards are areas covered by Councillors within Devon's eight local authority districts. There are 202 in Devon.

Electoral Divisions are areas covered by Devon County Council Councillors. There are 62 in Devon.

Devon Towns are locally defined areas for the main market and coastal towns in Devon and the rural areas surrounding them. There are 29 in Devon.

Districts are lower tier local authority districts, responsible for housing, environmental health, waste collection, council tax collection, local planning and licensing. There are eight in Devon.

Clinical Commissioning Group Sub-Localities are local groupings of GP practices and NHS teams which coordinate care. There are nine in Devon.



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
