ANNEX 1 – MANDATORY CONDITIONS

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There shall be no sale or supply of alcohol when there is no Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) in respect of this premises licence or at a time when the said Premises Supervisor does not hold a personal licence or when his/her licence is suspended.

Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Any person used to carry out a security activity must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises. In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises-

- (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to-
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
- (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).

The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol. The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

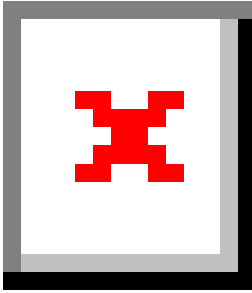
The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either-

- (a) a holographic mark, or
- (b) an ultraviolet feature.

The responsible person must ensure that-

(a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures-

- (i) beer or cider: pint;
- (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and



- (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
- (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than

the permitted price.

2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1-

(a) duty is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979

(b) permitted price is the price found by applying the formula-

$P = D + (D \times V)$ where-

(i) P is the permitted price,

(ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and

(iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;

(c) relevant person means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence-

(i) the holder of the premises licence,

(ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or

(iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;

(d) relevant person means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and

(e) valued added tax means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

4. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day (the first day) would be different from the permitted price on the next day (the second day) as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

ANNEX 2 – CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH THE OPERATING SCHEDULE

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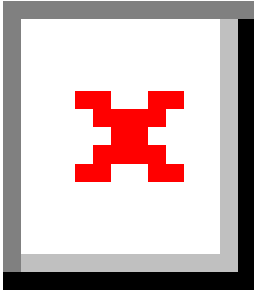
The external licensed area will be permanently demarcated with pavement studs.

In the external area alcohol may only be consumed by persons seated at tables.

Use of the external licensed area will cease at 20:30 daily. Suspended between 12.04.21 to 21.06.2021 by way of minor variation. Refer to Street Cafe Pavement licence

The door to the main bar shall be used only as an emergency exit between 23:00 and 07:00 on any day of the week. (Entry/egress shall be through the door that previously was used to access the upstairs area).

Any queue of persons wanting to enter the premises shall be managed in such a way so that the queue is formed away from Sidwell House.



Notices shall be displayed within the designated area, hatched on the attached plan, reminding all staff and residents to keep noise to a minimum because of disturbance this causes to neighbouring residents. The notice shall also state that noisy or anti-social behaviour will not be tolerated and will lead to refusal of entry into the premises.

All external doors (including fire doors) shall be effectively maintained and self closing. Unless in an emergency, all doors that are located in

rooms where any amplified music and/or voice is operating, shall not be propped open, or held open by any means.

Door Supervisors

Door supervisors will display correct name badge and will carry proof of registration.

Door supervisors will be used at a ratio to be agreed by the Police and the Licensing Authority (currently 1:75).

A female door supervisor will be available if searches are to be conducted on female customers.

Where there are five or more door supervisors at least one of these will be female.

Door supervisors will be in attendance at the entrance of the premises from 20:00 until the main exit doors to the premises are closed and at anytime when patrons may be queuing for access.

Door supervisors will wear clothing that can be easily identified on CCTV including a reflective number at least 100mm high in a prominent position on the upper part of the body.

Three door supervisors will be on duty from 20:00 until the premises is closed to the public and all customers have left.

CCTV

CCTV will be installed, maintained and operated to the satisfaction of the Chief Officer of Police .

Recordings will be in colour and kept for one month.

If the CCTV equipment is inoperative, the Police and the Licensing Authority will be informed as soon as possible and immediate steps will be taken to put the equipment back into action.

A notice will be displayed at the entrance to the premises advising that CCTV is in operation.

Bottles and Glasses

Alcoholic and soft drinks will be served in toughened glasses.

Alcoholic drinks will only be consumed inside the premises. Suspended between 12.04.21 to 21.06.2021 by way of minor variation. Refer to Street Cafe Pavement licence

No customers carrying open bottles or glasses will be admitted to the premises at anytime.

No customers will be permitted to take open containers of alcoholic or soft drinks from the premises. Suspended between 12.04.21 to 21.06.2021 by way of minor variation. Refer to Street Cafe Pavement licence
