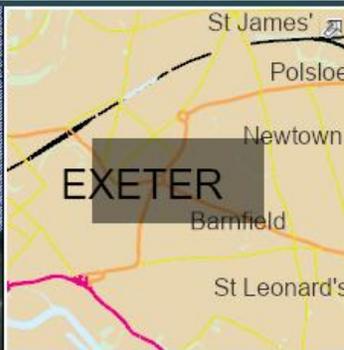

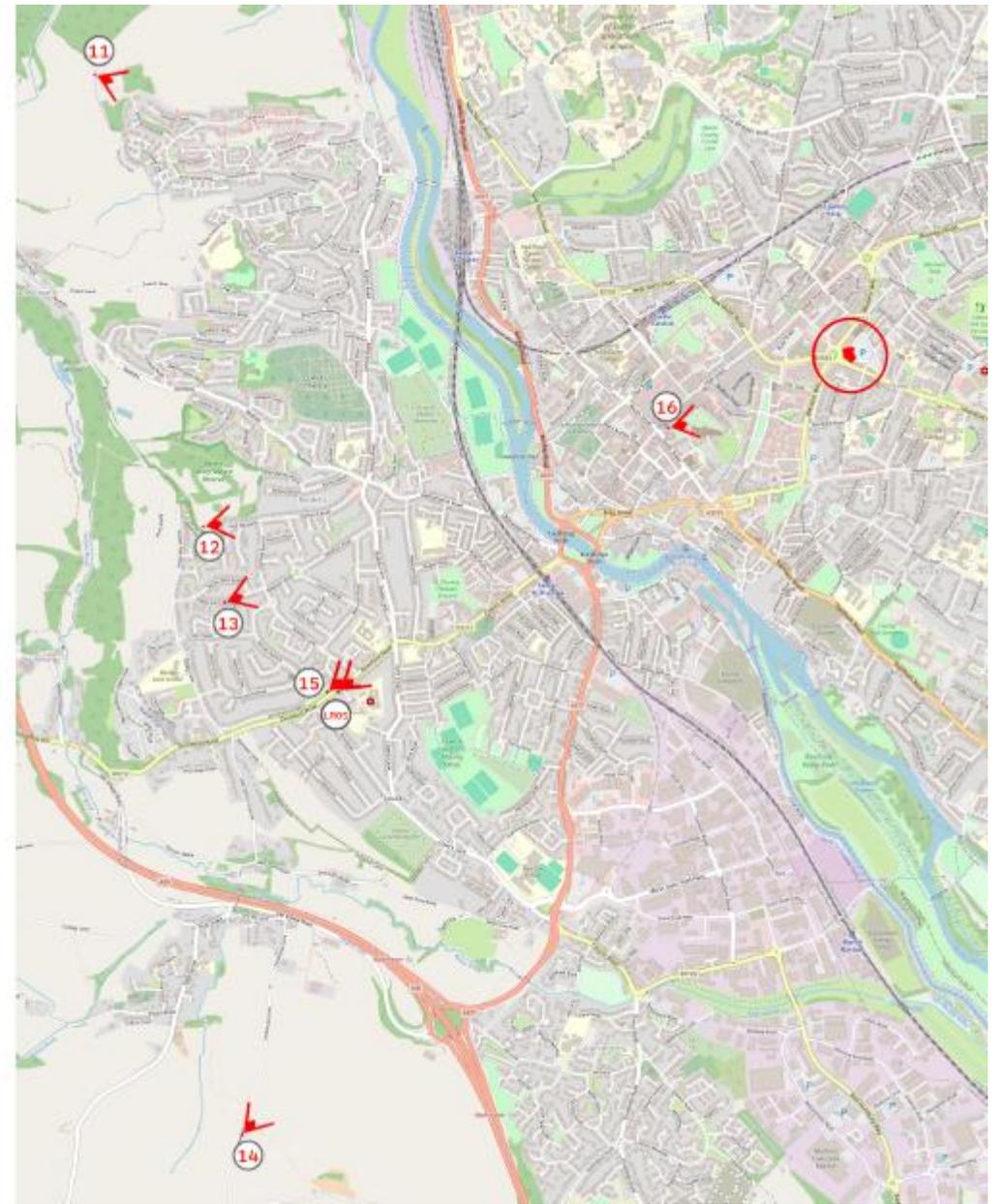
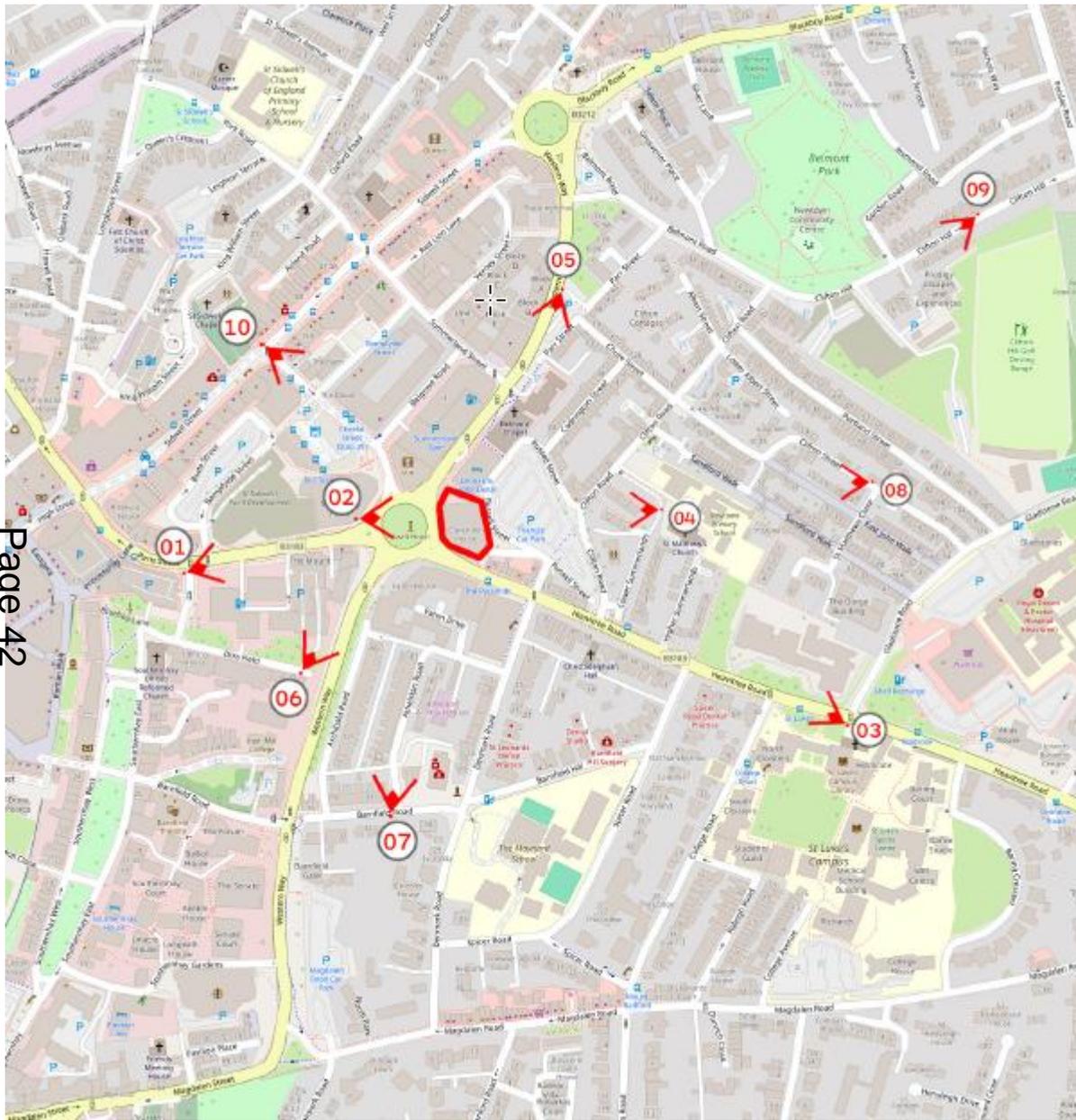
Comparative Building Heights Diagram

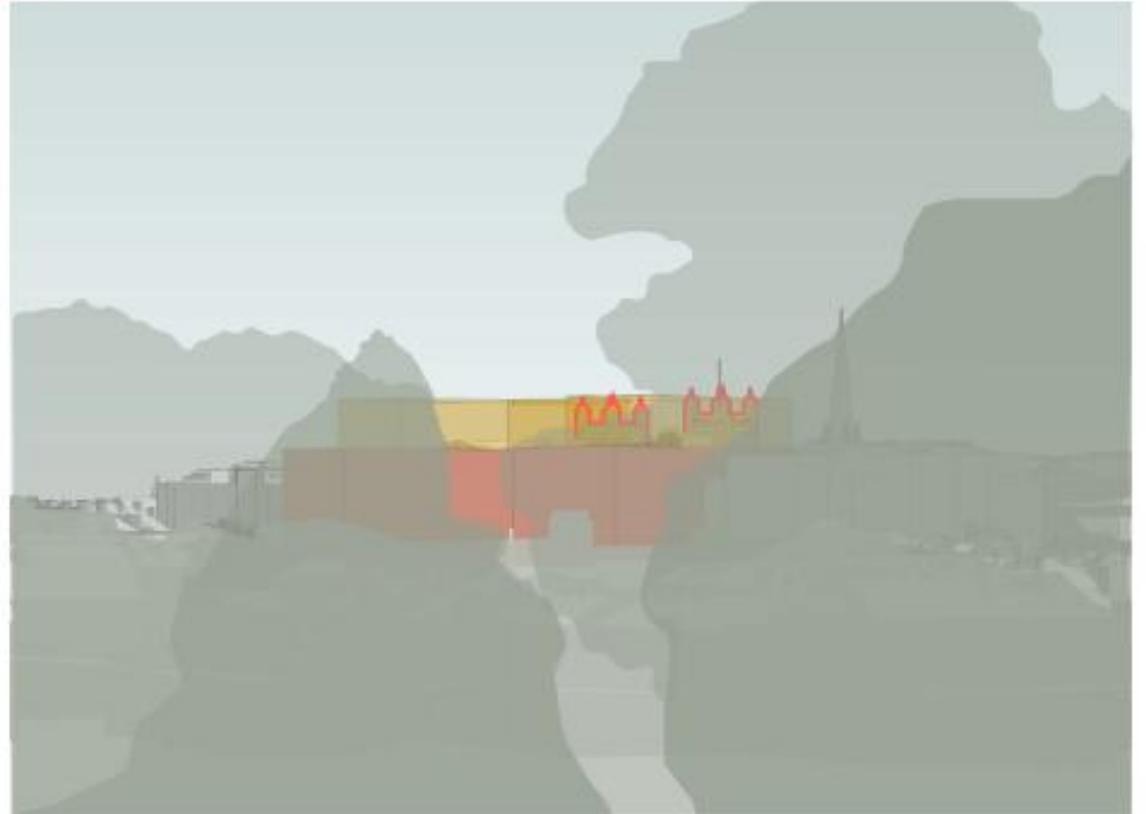

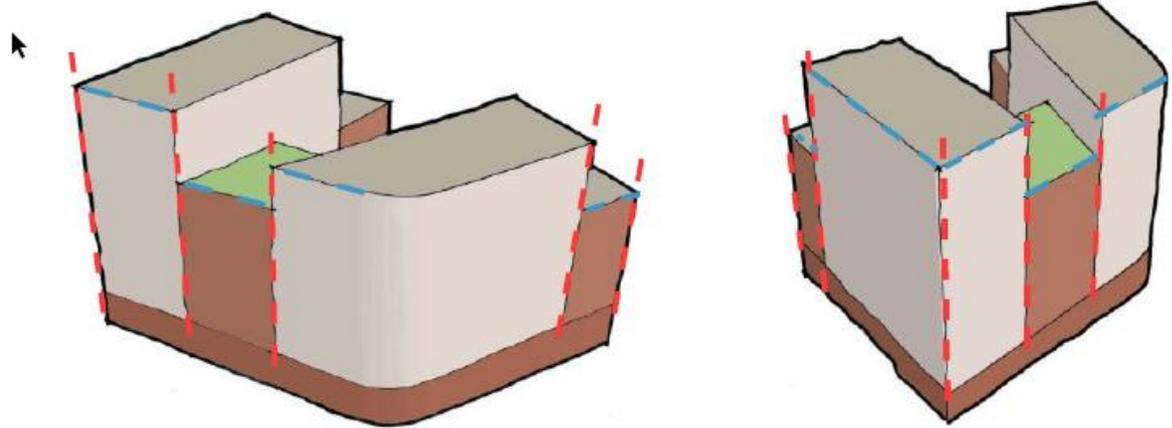

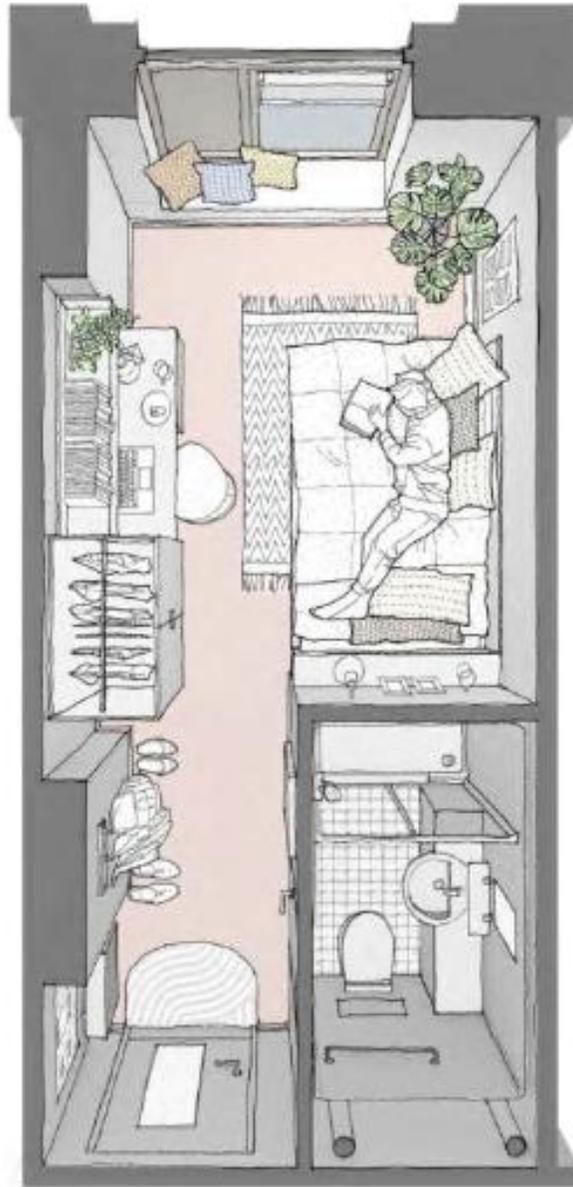

Student Welfare and Pastoral Care

Student wellbeing is central to the design and operation of the proposed PBSA scheme. A dedicated pastoral care provision is integrated into the ground floor layout, including private consultation rooms and a staffed management suite. These spaces offer support for mental health, academic pressures, and day-to-day wellbeing.

The building features a 24-hour staffed reception, providing a continuous point of contact for residents. This not only overlooks the external dwell spaces but allows early identification of welfare concerns and intervention where needed.

Social inclusion is encouraged through a range of shared amenity spaces. Multiple study and relaxation areas ensure that students have access to both quiet reflection and social interaction.

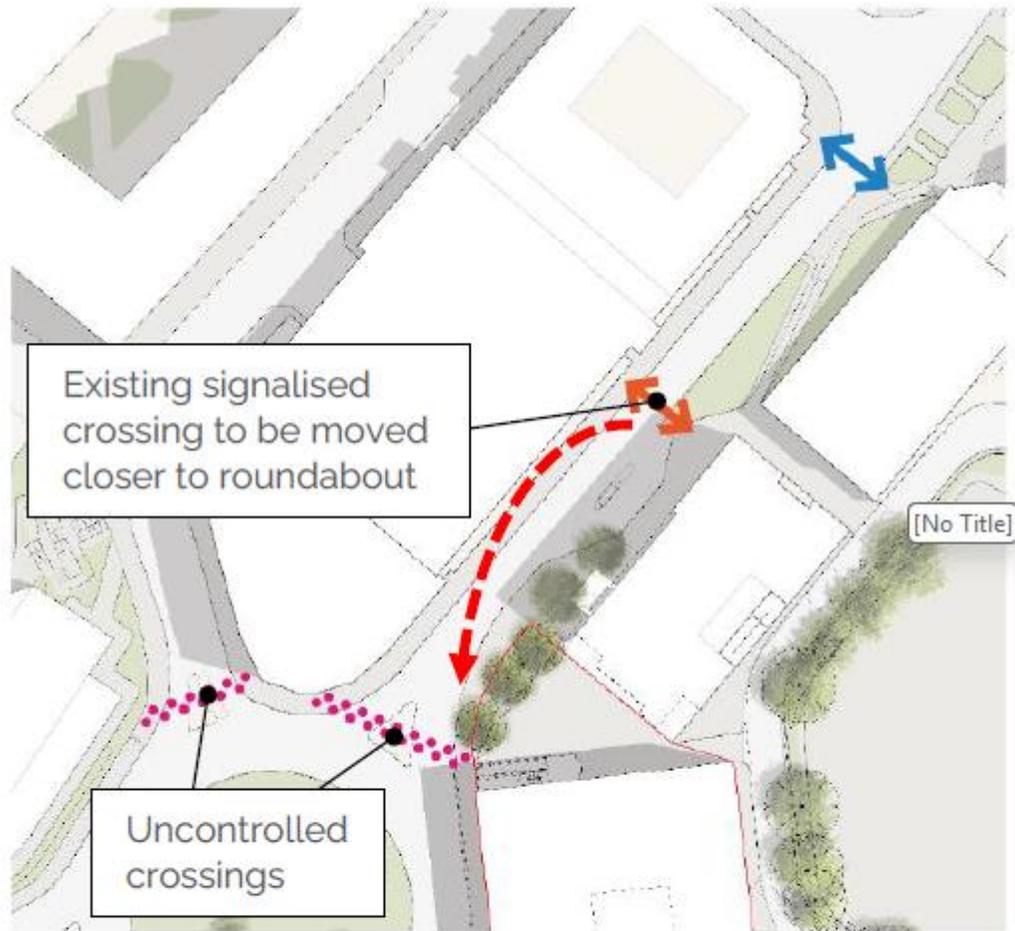

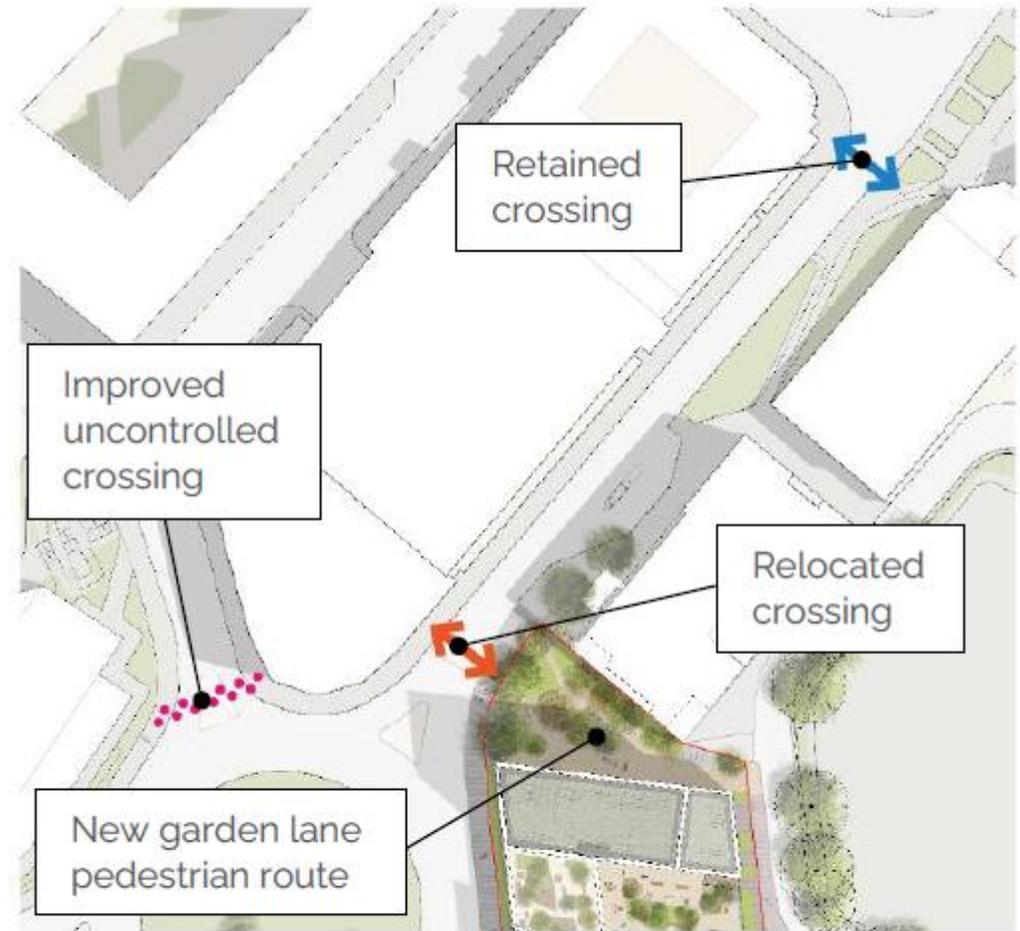

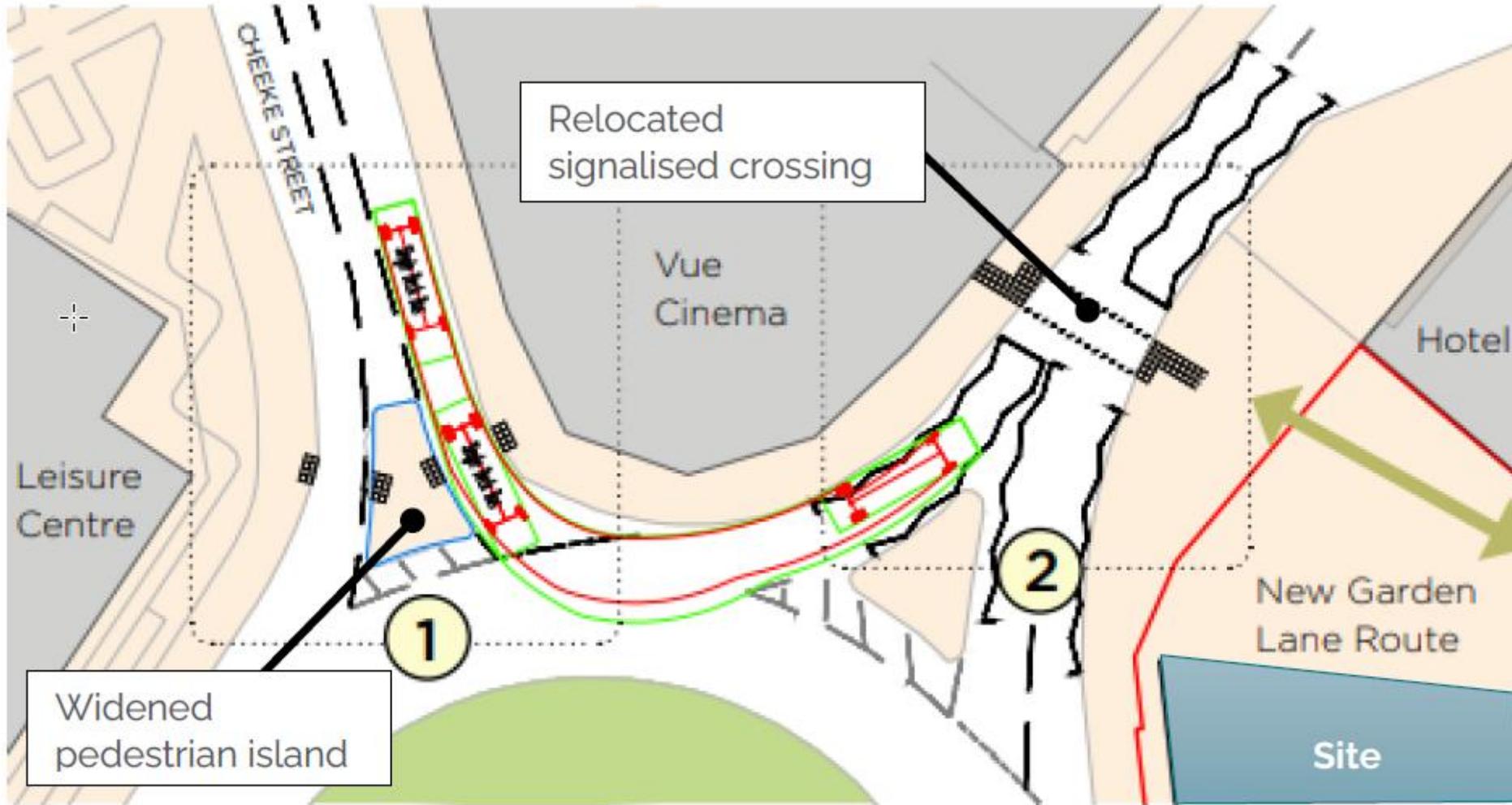


Figure 2.2: Improved Local Connectivity

KEY ISSUE: TRANSPORT (PEDESTRIAN CROSSINGS)

- **214.** Where a proposed development will lead to substantial harm to (or total loss of significance of) a designated heritage asset, local planning authorities should refuse consent, unless it can be demonstrated that the substantial harm or total loss is necessary to achieve substantial public benefits that outweigh that harm or loss, or all of the following apply:
 - a) the nature of the heritage asset prevents all reasonable uses of the site; and
 - b) no viable use of the heritage asset itself can be found in the medium term through appropriate marketing that will enable its conservation; and
 - c) conservation by grant-funding or some form of not for profit, charitable or public ownership is demonstrably not possible; and
 - d) the harm or loss is outweighed by the benefit of bringing the site back into use.
- **215.** Where a development proposal will lead to less than substantial harm to the significance of a designated heritage asset, this harm should be weighed against the public benefits of the proposal including, where appropriate, securing its optimum viable use.

Less than Substantial Harm to:

- Setting of the Grade 1 Cathedral
- Setting of the Grade 2 Eaton Place And Eaton's Place
- Failure to Preserve the Character and Appearance of the Lower Summerlands Conservation Area
- Failure to Preserve the Character, Appearance and Setting of the Belmont Conservation Area (Views From Clifton Hill)

Public Benefits (full list on pages 98-99 of the report):

- 297 well managed and well located student bedspaces (inc 11 accessible studios)
- Contribution towards easing pressure on housing – potential release of HMOs
- Contribution to housing targets (equivalent to 202 homes)
- 210sqm of commercial/community space – facilitating economic/community benefits

- Economic benefits from resident footfall & spend
- Jobs in operation/management/maintenance

- (NB: UPDATE SHEET) As financial contributions to greenspace and primary healthcare (and CIL) mitigate the impacts of the development, they should not be considered to weigh against heritage harm

The Council is not currently able to demonstrate a 5-year housing land supply (supply at 01 April 2025 was 4 years 3.2 months). As a consequence, the presumption in favour of sustainable development as set out in Paragraph 11 of the NPPF is to be applied.

The Supreme Court judgement confirmed that for the purposes of applying a tilt in favour of sustainable development, known as the 'tilted balance' (NPPF Para. 11(d)), policies of the development plan will remain applicable, but it will be for the local planning authority to determine the balance of policies for the protection of environment and amenity against the need for housing and the economy.

The tilted balance is therefore to be borne in mind when balancing the planning issues that have been outlined in the committee report.
