How a member of the public can ask a question at a Council or Committee meeting

Members of the public may ask questions at ordinary meetings of the Council, the Executive and Scrutiny Committees.

A question may only be asked if notice has been given by submitting no later than 10am, three working days before the day of the meeting.

After the meeting

The Local Government (Access to Information) Act 1985 requires us to publicly publish Council meeting agendas and minutes and accompanying documentation in which names of Public Speakers at Committee meetings will be recorded. We have a duty to look after the information we hold about you.

Council meetings may also be broadcast through social media and the press and other members of the public may be present at the meetings.
