To prevent crime and disorder	Yes	I'd like to object to the planned license change.
		Since the Quay Distillery opened in Spring 2022 there has been an increase in anti-social behaviour in the immediate area.I am a resident of Terracina Court which is adjacent to 60a Haven Road.
		Visitors to the premises on Haven Road park daily on the double yellow section of Haven Road, making it difficult for cars, buses and emergency vehicles to drive through Haven Road.
		Visitors of the premises regularly park in front of the door of Terracina Court which makes it difficult for residents to leave the building with prams, bicycles or groceries or leave our apartments in a safe way in case of an emergency.
		Complaints are regularly made to the council about loud music coming from the premises after 11 pm.
		People leaving the premises are loud, which is especially noticeable in the alleyway between Terracina Court and 60a Haven Road.
		This is the current situation; adding an additional pontoon that will be open 7 days a week until 11pm catering for up to 70 people will only increase this behaviour.
Public safety	Yes	The information published on several websites (including Yahoo.com and Devon Live) states that the floating bar will be open morning, noon and night and will feature a seating area, fire pit and bar area with both food and

		 drinks available; catering for up to 70 people on a pontoon measuring 55 square meters. Reading the above sentence alone makes you question how this can be a safe environment. Not just for visitors of a floating bar, but also for the public that uses the harbour for canoeing, kayaking and paddle boarding. According to fire & rescue regulations this plan exceeds the capacity of a regular seated Lounge/Bar, where occupancy is 1 person per 1 square meter.
		Will there be any adjustments made for disabled people to enter and exit this pontoon in a safe manner?
To prevent public nuisance	Yes	Noise: As stated before, even without the outside pontoon the premises is already responsible for noise in the immediate residential area. There is regular loud music after 11pm, including on weekdays. Visitors to the Quay Distillery often leave the premises in an intoxicated state and continue to sing and shout after leaving the premises. Litter: Visitors to the Quay Distillery regularly use the 8 feet alleyway between 60A Haven Road and Terracina Court as a public toilet. It has also been noted that vistors to the premises have seen using drugs outside the premises, underneath the balconies of my neighbours and in the alleyway. Smoke: Smoking in the premises is not allowed, which is why visitors smoke outside, either underneath the balconies of the apartments of Terracina Court or in the alleyway. Several residents of these apartments have a disability or have a small child. Adding an outside bar will increase the behaviour described above.
